ABOUT THE COURSE

The digital transformation of society has fundamentally altered the nature of crime, governance, evidence, and justice. Cybercrime today encompasses a wide spectrum of activities ranging from unauthorized access and financial fraud to identity theft, platform-enabled harms, and artificial intelligence-assisted offences. Simultaneously, legal systems are confronted with novel challenges concerning attribution of liability, admissibility of digital evidence, data protection, algorithmic governance, and access to justice in digital environments. This course provides an interdisciplinary examination of cybercrime and digital justice through the lens of contemporary Indian legal and regulatory frameworks. Drawing upon developments under the *Information Technology Act, 2000*, *Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023*, *Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, 2023*, *Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023*, and emerging AI governance initiatives, the course seeks to develop critical understanding of the evolving relationship between technology, law, and justice.

SESSION DETAILS

- One session per day on Zoom (live).
- Recording of the session will be shared with the all register participant after each session.
- Session shall be of 1.5 hours.
- An assessment will be conducted after the certificate course.
- *Participants must secure a minimum of 50% marks in assessment to qualify for certification.*

ASSESSMENT METHODOLOGY

The assessment will comprise 30 MCQs. Participants will have 15 minutes to complete the test and must secure at least 15 out of 30 marks (50%) to qualify.

Rounding-Off Rule:

Percentage scores will be rounded to the nearest whole number. Scores with a decimal value below 0.50 will be rounded down, while scores with a decimal value of 0.50 or above will be rounded up. For example, 74.49% will be considered 74%, and 74.50% will be considered 75%.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION

Participants who attend each session and maintain *a minimum of 75% attendance for every session*, AND score *at least 50% in the final assessment*, will be awarded a Certificate of Completion.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The registration will be deemed completed when the registration form has been duly filled and required fee, if any, is submitted.
- Timely submission of feedback form is mandatory after each session.
- *75 percent attendance is mandatory for each session.*
- All participants who attend the 7-day certificate course are required to appear for the final evaluation assessment. Appearing for the assessment is mandatory, and the grade obtained will be reflected on the certificate issued upon successful completion of the course.
