INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON ARBITRATION, PEACE BUILDING AND GLOBAL GOVERNANCE (ISAPG - 2026)



The conference is built on one core premise: the world's dispute resolution infrastructure, courts, tribunals, and arbitral institutions were designed for a pre-digital era, and it is buckling under volume, cost, and distance. Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) is no longer an experimental alternative; it is already resolving real disputes at scale, from SEBI's SMART ODR portal to algorithmic deactivation disputes in the gig economy to cross-border commercial arbitration conducted entirely over video.

This conference brings together law, technology, policy, and peacebuilding communities, practitioners, academics, regulators, technologists, and students to examine where ODR currently stands, where it is failing, and where it is headed next.





WHAT THE CONFERENCE AIMS TO DO?

This conference seeks to advance the global discourse on Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) by moving beyond isolated case studies and developing a shared understanding of successful practices and persistent challenges across jurisdictions/ It aims to expand the scope of ODR beyond its traditional focus on e-commerce and banking disputes by exploring its application in institutional peacebuilding, post-conflict mediation, humanitarian dispute resolution, and community reconciliation areas that remain largely underrepresented in mainstream ODR discussions. The conference also critically examines the role of emerging technologies in dispute resolution, balancing discussions on AI-assisted mediation, algorithmic decision-making, and blockchain-based settlements with important concerns surrounding bias, accountability, digital exclusion, and the appropriate limits of automation.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- Abstracts must be original, unpublished, and relevant to the conference theme. The listed sub-themes are indicative and not exhaustive; submissions on related topics aligned with the theme are also welcome.
- Abstracts must be between 300–350 words, accompanied by at least five keywords, and should clearly state the research objective, research question, and the intended contribution of the manuscript.
- Full papers must be between 3,000–5,000 words.
- Authors shall not include their names, affiliations, or any identifying details in the manuscript.
- Co-authorship is permitted for a maximum of two authors per paper.
- The manuscript shall be typed in Times New Roman, font size 12, with 1.5-line spacing and justified alignment.
- Headings shall be in Times New Roman, font size 14, and bold.
- Footnotes shall be in Times New Roman, font size 10, with single line spacing.
- Plagiarism is not allowed. A similarity index of 10-15% is allowed.
- All citations and references shall be uniform and must conform to the Bluebook (20th Edition) citation format.
- Submissions must be made only in .doc or .docx format.
- Participants are required to submit only the abstract at the initial stage. Full papers shall be submitted upon acceptance of the abstract.
- Registration fees once paid are non-refundable.
- Submission of an abstract or paper shall be deemed as acceptance of all conference rules and guidelines.
- The decision of the Organising Committee regarding acceptance, scheduling, and publication of submissions shall be final and binding.
