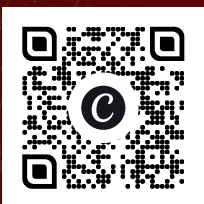

Shri Palkhivala is perhaps best remembered for his pivotal role in the landmark case of *Kesavananda Bharati v. State of Kerala*, in which he successfully advanced the doctrine of the basic structure of the Constitution. This doctrine remains one of the cornerstones of Indian constitutional jurisprudence and continues to safeguard the fundamental principles upon which the Constitution is founded.

Equally significant was his contribution to the development of Indian tax law. Through his scholarship, advocacy, and public engagement, Shri Palkhivala helped shape generations of legal practitioners and inspired a deeper understanding of the relationship between taxation, governance, and constitutionalism. His annual analyses of the Union Budget became widely celebrated for their clarity, depth, and accessibility, reflecting his remarkable ability to bridge the worlds of law, economics, and public policy.

Beyond his professional accomplishments, Shri Palkhivala embodied the ideals of integrity, intellectual rigour, and public service. His life serves as a lasting reminder of the transformative role that law can play in preserving democratic institutions and advancing the public good.

In doing so, it seeks to foster intellectual curiosity, strengthen legal research methodologies, and cultivate the precision and clarity of expression that are indispensable to the legal profession.

The incorporation of a research-oriented component further enriches the overall experience of the competition by extending the spirit of advocacy beyond the courtroom and into the realm of scholarship. As the Nani A. Palkhivala Memorial National Moot Court Competition continues to evolve, the Research Paper Competition reflects the organisers' enduring commitment to advancing legal education, promoting academic excellence, and encouraging meaningful engagement with the complexities of taxation law.

Instructions

The following themes have been selected for this year's Research Paper Competition:

- **The Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023 and Tax Surveillance: A Constitutional Collision?**
- **The Faceless Tax Regime: Has the Objective of Enhancing Efficiency, Transparency, and Accountability Been Achieved, or Has the Right to Be Heard Become Illusory?**
- **The Shifting Burden of Proof in Financial and Tax Laws: Has the Jurisprudence Evolved Unfairly?** *(with specific reference to the Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002; the Prohibition of Benami Property Transactions Act, 1988; the Goods and Services Tax regime; the Income-tax Act, 1961; and the Black Money (Undisclosed Foreign Income and Assets) and Imposition of Tax Act, 2015).*

Each submission may be authored by upto two participants. Entries will be evaluated by a distinguished panel comprising judges, advocates, chartered accountants, and eminent academicians. The three highest-ranked submissions will be awarded cash prizes and certificates of merit.

The winning paper will be considered for publication in the AIFTP-WZ Journal, the official online platform of the ITAT Bar Association, Mumbai, and other leading publications in the field of taxation law.

Participants are required to submit their manuscripts through the Google Form on or before **1st October 2026**.

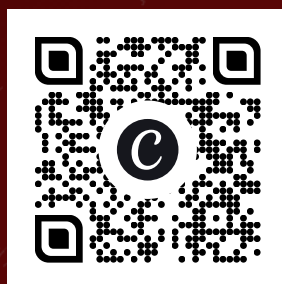
Registration & Payment

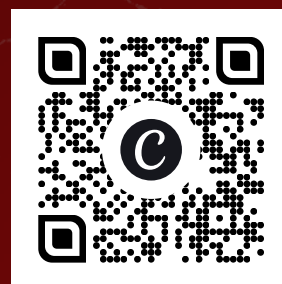
