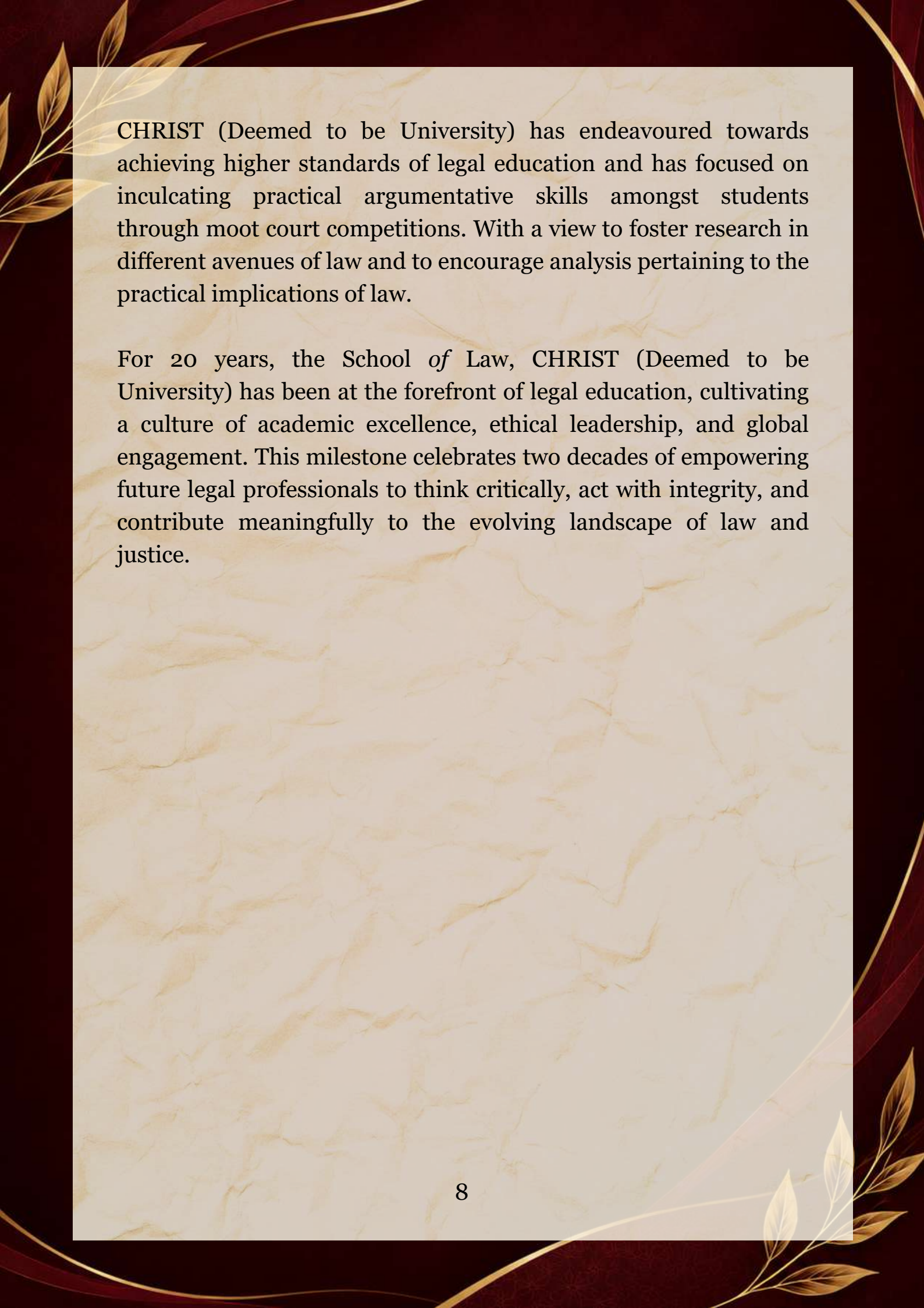

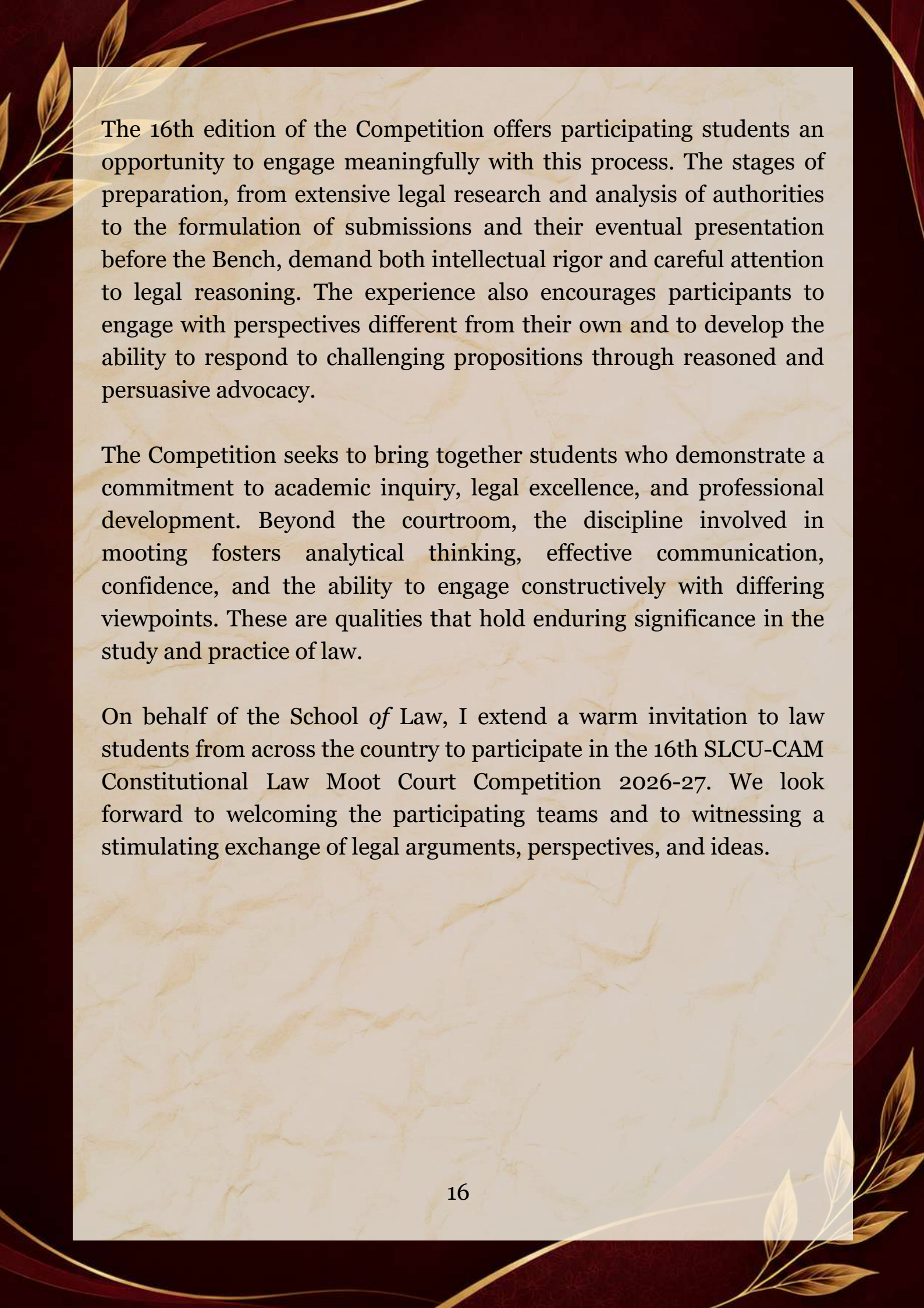
MESSAGE FROM THE ASSOCIATE HOD

ABOUT THE MOOT COURT COMPETITION

The 16th Edition of SLCU-CAM Constitutional Law Moot Court Competition, 2026-27, of School of Law, CHRIST (Deemed to be University), is being conducted offline following the successful conduct of the 15 editions of the competition. The flagship mooting event aims to provide a rigorous and testing ground for developing legal proficiency in practical application, research, and oratory skills and widen legal knowledge in the various facets of law, especially the ones contemporary in nature. The event, over its many editions, has brought together the brightest of mooting minds and aims to achieve the same this year. The 16th Edition's proposition revolves around Constitutional Law. The flagship event is being conducted in association with the prestigious law firm Cyril Amarchand Mangaldas, as the title partner of the 16th SLCU-CAM Constitutional Law Moot Court Competition, 2026-27, to support the competition's objective of providing a holistic experience of mooting. For the 16th Edition of the Competition, SCC Online (Supreme Court Cases Online) have been selected as knowledge partners while SCC Times has been selected as the media partner, leveraging their expertise to enhance the event's reach and impact.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

I. INTRODUCTION

The 16th SLCU-CAM Constitutional Law Moot Court Competition, 2026-27 (hereinafter referred to as the “Competition”) is the flagship event of the School of Law, CHRIST (Deemed to be University) and is scheduled from 11th December 2026 to 13th December 2026. The competition is a “Reserved Moot Court Competition” with a team cap of 42 teams and will be conducted in offline mode by the Moot Court Society, School of Law, CHRIST (Deemed to be University).

II. PARTICIPATION

All law colleges/institutions/universities across the country recognized by the Bar Council of India are eligible to take part in the Competition. All participants must be currently pursuing their Bachelor’s degree in Law, i.e., either 3-year or 5-year courses. Only 1 team from a college/institution/university shall be allowed to participate. All team members must be enrolled in the same college/institution/university.

III. REGISTRATION

Registration shall be successful upon completion of all formalities mentioned in the rules. Last day for Online Registration is 2nd November, 2026 - 23:59 hours. Request for Refund of Registration Fee shall not be entertained. Click on the button below for the Registration Portal. Registration will be confirmed only after payment of the requisite fees. IV. GENERAL

a. TEAM COMPOSITION : Each participating team can comprise either two (2) or three (3) members. In the case of two (2) members, both members shall be designated as speakers. In case of three (3) members, two (2) members shall be designated as speakers and one (1) member shall be designated as the researcher. No change in the composition of the team shall be entertained after the completion of registration.

b. OFFICIAL LANGUAGE : The official language of the competition shall be English. All competition rounds, memoranda and the compendiums must be in English.

c. REGISTRATION FEES : The registration fee will be collected in two phases.

Phase 1: A base registration fee Rs. 4,500/- (inclusive of GST) applicable to all teams wishing to participate in the competition.

Phase 2: An additional fee of Rs. 3,500/- (inclusive of GST) applicable exclusively to teams opting for accommodation.

Where a team has opted out of accommodation services and has paid registration fee accordingly, they cannot make any future requests to provide accommodation. Likewise, where a team has already opted in for accommodation, they will not be permitted to later opt out and receive refund for the same. Registration fee is only payable in favour of CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Bengaluru. The following are the steps to be followed for payment of the aforesaid registration fee:

Step 1: Open Christ University's official website (<http://christuniversity.in>) and select the option of 'Online Payment Portal' from the 'E-Services' dropdown menu. Following this, click on the 'Online Payment Portal' at the bottom of the webpage.

Step 2: The aforesaid tab shall redirect to the main page of the online payment portal wherein it is required to select 'Central Campus', followed by 'Fest' in the 'Select Fee Name' dropdown menu. This shall enable another dropdown menu titled 'Select category'.

Step 3: There shall be an option of '16th SLCU Moot Court Competition - Registration Fee1- ext.' in the said dropdown menu which once selected shall proceed towards the payment process. Page 26 of this brochure has illustrations to guide you on the same.

d. **DRESS CODE** : The dress code for all participants throughout the competition shall be: Men- White shirt, black blazer, black trousers, black shoes, and black tie. Women- White shirt/kurta, black blazer, black trousers and black shoes.

c. **PRELIMINARY ROUNDS:** The preliminary rounds shall be conducted in two stages. Each stage will have one preliminary round where each team will represent either the petitioner/applicant or respondent for that round. Sides will be determined by way of draw of lots as explained in preceding clause. Each team will face a different team and a different bench in both the preliminary rounds. The qualification to Quarter-Finals will be determined based on the Round Point System as explained in Provision VI of the Rulebook.

d. **ADDENDUM:** Each Team before the Preliminary Round 1 will be assigned a unique alpha numeric code (This code is different from the Team code). All teams with an even number code shall be Petitioner/Applicant for the Preliminary round 1 and all teams with an odd number code shall be Respondent for the Preliminary round 1. If a team is allotted Petitioner/Applicant for Preliminary Round 1, the same team shall be representing Respondent for Preliminary Round 2. Prior to the conduction of rounds, in furtherance of transparency, the Moot Court Society shall conduct draw of lots offline to determine the fixtures of the respective rounds.

e. **OCTA-FINAL ROUNDS:** The top sixteen (16) teams selected by way of Provision VI of the Rulebook shall qualify for the Octa-Final Round. A seeding chart shall be prepared with ranks being given to the top sixteen (16) teams. To ensure fair play, power matchup shall determine the fixtures, which shall be prepared with the top sixteen (16) teams in such a way that Rank one (1) goes against Rank sixteen (16), Rank two (2) goes against Rank fifteen (15), and so on. The sides on behalf of which the teams shall argue will be determined by way of draw of lots.

V. COMPETITION FORMAT

The 16th SLCU-CAM Constitutional Law Moot Court Competition, 2026-27 (subject to a strict cap of 42 teams) shall primarily consist of oral rounds, preceded by a Researcher's Test. The competition shall proceed through the Preliminary Rounds, Octa-Final Rounds, Quarter-Final Round, Semi-Final Round, and the Final Round. The Octa, Quarter-Final, Semi-Final, and Final Rounds shall be knockout rounds where each team will argue only once either for the Petitioner/Applicant or Respondent, which is to be decided by a draw of lots between the competing teams.

a. **RESEARCHER'S TEST:** The Researcher's Test will be conducted in offline mode on 11th December 2026. The questions for the test shall be objective with the questions based on the applicable law, precedents and facts pertaining to the Moot Proposition i.e., MCQ based test. There shall be a total of 25 Questions for 2 marks each. The test shall be taken by the team's researcher. In case the team has no designated researcher, one of the speakers shall be required to take the Researcher's Test. The participant shall bring no additional material such as the bare text of Acts, Memorandum, etc. apart from stationary for the test and the Organizing Committee (hereinafter referred to as "OC") shall provide no such material. Please note that the marks scored in the test shall not contribute to the overall score and is only to determine the winner of the Best Researcher's award. Rules and Regulations with regards to the conduct of Researcher's test shall be sent to the participants in due time.

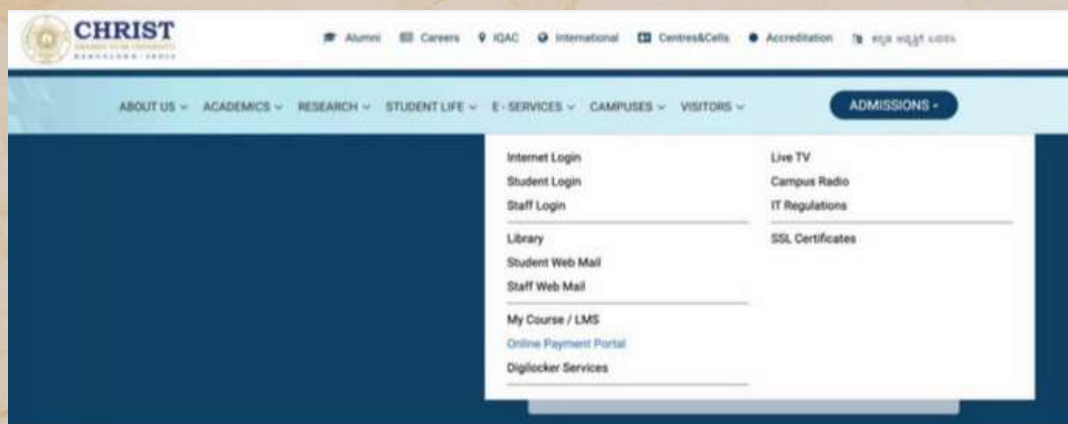
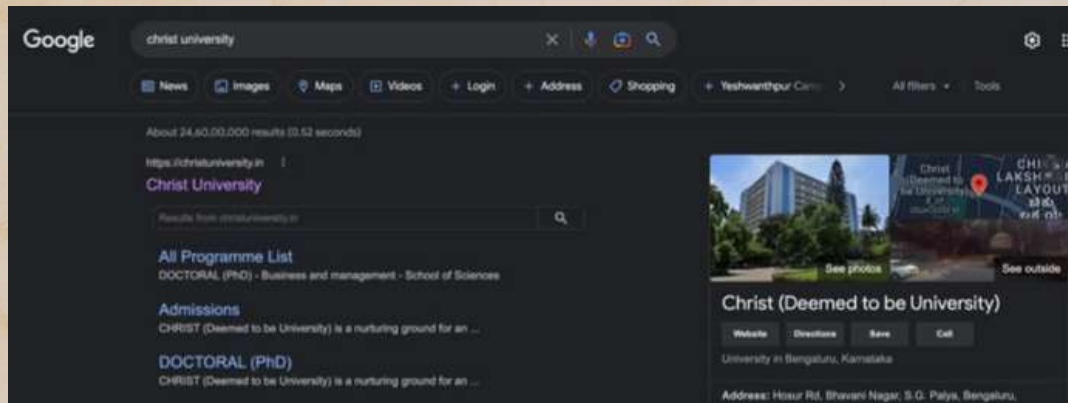
b. **DRAW OF LOTS:** The Draw of Lots shall be conducted in an offline mode on 11th December 2026 to determine the fixtures.

f. **QUARTER-FINAL ROUNDS:** The top eight (8) teams selected by way of Provision VI of the Rulebook shall qualify for the quarter-final round. A seeding chart shall be prepared with ranks being given to the top 8 teams. To ensure fair play, power matchup shall determine the fixtures which shall be prepared with the top eight (8) teams in such a way that Rank one (1) goes against Rank eight (8), Rank two (2) goes against Rank seven (7) and so on. The sides on behalf of which the teams shall argue will be determined by way of draw of lots.

g. **SEMI-FINAL ROUNDS:** The top four (4) teams selected by way of Provision VI of the Rulebook shall qualify for the semi-final round. A seeding chart shall be prepared with ranks being given to the top 4 teams. To ensure fair play, power match-up shall determine the fixtures. Rank one (1) will go against Rank four (4) and Rank two (2) against Rank three (3). The sides on behalf of which the teams shall argue will be determined by way of draw of lots.

h. **FINAL ROUNDS:** The top two (2) teams selected by way of Provision VI of the Rulebook shall qualify for the final round. The sides on behalf of which the teams shall argue will be determined by way of draw of lots.

CANTEENS AND LEISURE

Spacious cafeterias offering quality and fresh food, beverages and drinks are spread across the campus. Ivy Hall, below the Auditorium Block, and Gourmet, below the Central Block, provides for a variety of eateries and snacks. Block IV contains food outlets in the cellar that serve the same purpose. Just Bake, an outlet behind the basketball court, serves fresh desserts and refreshments, including the popular brownies and cupcakes. The iconic birds park restaurant caters dishes and meals of both Indian and East Asian cuisines. Fresheteria and the Nandini Milk Parlour, adjacent to Block I provide for a quick refreshment with quick bites, hot and cold beverages.

CLEAN CAMPUS

The entire campus is a Zero Plastic Zone, with dustbins located strategically around the entire campus to prevent any form of littering. All the waste is segregated at the time of disposal itself through bins allotted for different categories of waste. Most of this collected waste is recycled within the campus. The University has established a paper recycling unit within the campus, along with a charcoal driven wet waste recycling unit. This initiative is driven

and supported by the student body of Centre for Social Action (CSA).

BIRD'S PARK

The Birds' Park is an iconic location in the campus, adorned with a variety of birds. It also has a kiosk and canteen outlet providing snacks and refreshments, with an open seating area and a Gazebo.

XEROX, PRINTING AND STATIONERY FACILITIES

There are three locations within the campus that provide Xerox and Printing facilities, including prints, spiral binding and other additional options. One outlet is located in the Auditorium block (Ivy hall), another in Central block (Gourmet), and the last one at the cellar below Block IV. Stationary, in variety, can be obtained at the same locations, and at the Christ Book Stall located at Central Block (Gourmet). All locations remain open till early evening and provide quick and quality printing services.

HEALTH CENTRES

The University has 3 Health Centres located around the campus. These Centres administer prompt first aid and basic health care services. The locations of the same are provided below: Central Block, Gourmet Extension (Dr. Asha Pinto Medical Officer); Block II, 2nd Floor, Room No. 710 (Ms. Sheena Joseph); Block IV, 4th Floor, Room No. 475 (Ms. Liji Abraham).

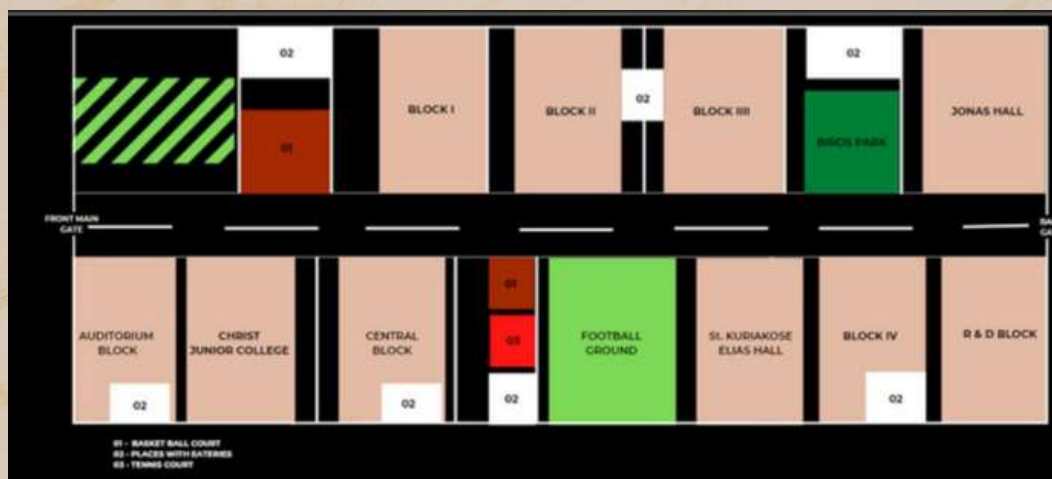
