Year 2022 was the 500th Anniversary of the cannon ball moment of St. Ignatius of Loyola. To commemorate & reflect upon the spiritual conversion of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuit Order, and its significance, XSLAJ had geared up to celebrate the 501st Anniversary of the Cannon Ball Moment by organizing the National Chapter of its Flagship Event - Trial & Advocacy Competition - in the name of St. Ignatius of Loyola - "IGNITAC - Ignatius National Trial & Advocacy Competition 2023". And, hence continuing the legacy in 2026.

'THE CANNONBALL MOMENT': FROM PROFESSION TO PURPOSE

St. Ignatius was a Spanish priest and theologian who founded the Jesuit order in 1534 and was one of the most influential figures in the Counter-Reformation. Known for its missionary, educational, and charitable works, the Jesuit order was a leading force in the modernizing of the Roman Catholic Church. The 'cannonball moment' dates back to when the citadel of Pamplona was held in siege by the French and every soldier wanted to surrender to the enemy line, against the wish of all the nobles, he decided to hold the line against the enemy. He stood bravely until a cannon from the enemy lines broke his foot, which left him temporarily immobile. It is, he states in his biography, this moment that changed his life forever. It was during this time of being bedridden that, due to the lack of any other, he was forced to read books of Saints, which changed his whole worldview and later reformed the Jesuits a whole. Thus, if it was not for that cannonball - the course of history would have been changed.

Rev. Dr. John Felix Raj, SJ, (born in 1954) is a Jesuit of the Calcutta Province of the Society of Jesus. A dynamic personality, he was the Principal (2009-2017) of St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata, Vice-Principal (1997-2009), and is the Founder Vice-Chancellor and Professor of Economics of St. Xavier's University, Kolkata and the former Rector (1996-2002). Father Felix Raj is the Director of The Goethals Indian Library and Research Society. He was a member of the West Bengal State Education Commission. He was also the Vice-President and Secretary of the Bengal Economic Association. His selfless work in the field of social development through education has made him the recipient of fourteen awards including Banga Bibhushan and Siksha Ratna from Government of West Bengal. Fr. Felix Raj is a prolific writer and has authored and co-authored nine books. He has also published numerous papers and articles in journals and newspapers.

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COMPETITION FORMAT

Given below are the details of the segments, aspects and sub-events related to the competition.

CLAUSE I - COMPETITION ROUNDS & QUALIFICATION CRITERIA

A. Preliminary Rounds (Prelims I & II)

There shall be 2 Preliminary Rounds, namely Prelims I & II. Each team shall argue from either side - Prosecution or Defense, as allotted in the draw of lots, in both rounds. The opposing teams for both rounds will be decided through the draw of lots.

Saving Clause: In Prelims - II, the team shall, under no circumstances, argue against the team against whom they had argued in Prelims - I.

The marks of each preliminary round shall be the cumulative total of the marks of the oral submissions of both the speakers and the marks of the Memorial Submission. The Qualifiers for the Quarter Final rounds shall be the Top Eight (8) teams of the preliminary rounds.

B. Quarter-Finals (QF)

The Quarter-Final Rounds would be **Knockout Rounds**, i.e., in this round, one team from each Court would qualify. Each team shall argue from one of the sides as allotted in the Draw of Lots. The marks of the quarter-final rounds shall be the cumulative total of the marks of oral submissions of both the speakers and the team scoring higher would be moving ahead to the Semi-Finals. 4 Teams scoring the highest marks from their respective Trial Rounds would qualify to the Semi-Finals.

C. Semi-Finals (SF)

The Semi-Finals Rounds would be **Knockout Rounds**, i.e., in this round, one team from each Court would qualify. Each team shall argue from one of the sides as allotted in the Draw of Lots. The marks of the semi-final rounds shall be the cumulative total of the marks of oral submissions of both the speakers and the team scoring higher would be moving ahead to the Final Round. 2 Teams scoring the highest marks from their respective Trial Rounds would qualify to the Final Round.

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D. The Final Round

In the final round, each team shall argue from one of the sides as allotted in the draw of lots. The marks of the Final Round shall be the cumulative total of the marks of oral submissions of both the speakers and the team scoring higher would be declared as the winner.

CLAUSE II - SUB-EVENTS & OTHER ASPECTS

A. Researcher's Test

Each Team's Researcher shall appear for the Researcher's Test. The Test will be taken in MCQ Format. The researcher that obtains the highest marks in the test will be awarded the "Best Researcher" Prize, at the end of the Competition. The team which fails to send their researcher for the exam, will not be considered for the "Best Researcher" Prize.

Marking Scheme: +2 for every correct answer, -0.5 for every incorrect answer;

Total No. of Questions: 30

Time Allotted: 15 Mins

B. Ex-Parte Rounds

This is a specially provisioned round, in case of an Odd Number of Memorial Submissions at the end of the Last Date of Submission, which implies that the number of teams participating in the competition are odd. Hence, all except 1 team will be paired opposite to another team for the Prelims. The Ex-Parte Round is meant for that team, which has no team to pair up against. In the Ex-Parte Round, the left-out team will be facing the Judges as their opponent. The rules and regulations of the round as same as the other rounds, with the only difference of the direct involvement of the judges as the Opponent Team. The team subjected to this round will be graded accordingly, i.e. equitably - at par with the other teams.

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CLAUSE III - WITNESSES & WITNESS BRIEFING

A. Witness Provisions

Two Witnesses will be provided by the Organizing Committee - 30 minutes prior to the respective Trial Rounds for each team in the Preliminary Rounds, and the rounds that shall follow (including the Final Round) The set of witnesses for each team will be selected by the Draw of Lots.

B. Witness Briefing Session & Evaluation

I. Witness Briefing Time: The time of 30 Minutes for the Witness Briefing prior to the Trial Rounds remains constant throughout the competition - in all rounds.

II. Evaluation: The Speakers will be evaluated independently from the Witnesses allotted to their respective teams. The Witness Deposition solely depends upon the Briefing given by the Team Members to their respective witnesses during the Briefing Session before the oral rounds.

C. Witness Training

All the witness participants will be given proper training before the competition.

Note: The Organizing Committee does not take liability of the performance of any witness of any team during the competition and cannot be held accountable for the same.

D. Qualification of Witnesses

Quarter-Finals: Top 16 Witnesses with the highest marks from the Prelims, shall advance to the Quarter-Final Rounds. These rounds would be Knockout Rounds, i.e., in this round, 2 witnesses from each Court Room will qualify.

Semi- Finals: 8 witnesses shall advance to the Semi-Final Rounds. This round would be Knockout Rounds, i.e., in this round, 2 witnesses from each Court will qualify.

The Final Round: 4 witnesses shall advance to the Final Round. The witness with the highest marks shall be declared as the Best Witness.

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CLAUSE IV - MEMORIAL SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

The memorials for both the sides shall be submitted in **both online and offline** mode, within the specified date. **(Date for Offline Submission: Wednesday, 4th November, 2026 & 1st November, 2026 for Online Submissions)** **PDF**

Late submissions of the memorials shall not be accepted under any circumstance. Any team failing to submit the memorial within the specified time shall stand disqualified. **The teams must submit the memorial in PDF form only in Online mode. 4 sets of both Prosecution & Defense i.e. 4x2 = 8 memorial copies are required to be submitted in offline mode. If there is any inconsistency between the documents submitted, the team shall be disqualified.**

B. Team Codes

Each team shall be allotted a unique team code. Teams should not disclose their identity or that of their institution, etc., under any circumstances and such disclosure shall invite penalties including disqualification from the Competition directly. The decision for the same shall be at the discretion of the Organizers.

CLAUSE II - DRESS CODE⁽ⁱ⁾

- Law Formals (Black Suit, Trousers, Tie & Shoes, and White Shirt)
